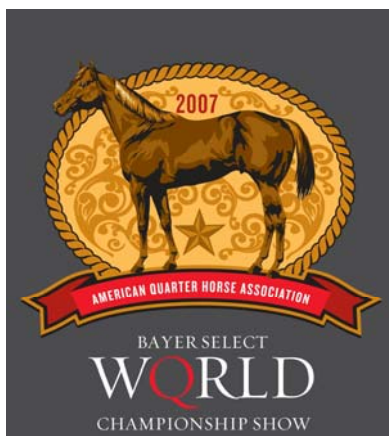


Bayer Select

The 2007 Bayer Select World Championship Show will offer exciting competition for American Quarter Horse Association Amateur Select members August 28-September 2 at the Amarillo National Center. The Bayer Select World Show is the world's largest, single-breed world championship horse show open exclusively to amateur exhibitors age 50 and older. This is the pinnacle event for Amateur Select competitors around the world who must qualify for the event by earning a predetermined number of points to secure a spot in each of the 41 classes representing English, western and halter disciplines.
