

EXAMPLES OF AQHA CLASS APPROVAL

This show bill excerpt was taken directly from an Alachua County 4-H & Open Show schedule found online to demonstrate how AQHA classes may be added to a current show bill.

In example 1, AQHA-approved classes are indicated in red and follow AQHA class nomenclature. These classes are held separately and are for AQHA members who hold current AQHA memberships in those divisions.

EXAMPLE 1

9. Jr. Showmanship H/W*

10. AQHA Novice Youth Showmanship 18-under

11. AQHA Youth Showmanship 18-under

12. Sr. Showmanship H/W*

13. AQHA Novice Amateur Showmanship

14. AQHA Amateur Showmanship

15. Open Showmanship H/W*

** In this example, H/W indicates exhibitors may show in English or western attire in these non AQHA-approved classes. Note, in AQHA Showmanship, AQHA rules apply meaning exhibitors are only allowed to exhibit in western attire.*

In example 2, AQHA-approved classes are indicated in red and follow AQHA class nomenclature. Here, classes 18 and 21 are open classes that additionally have AQHA approval. Registered American Quarter Horses and current AQHA members competing in these classes will receive separate placings outside overall placings for the class. Classes 19, 20 and 22 are separate classes as indicated above.

EXAMPLE 2

18. Jr. Hunter Pleasure & AQHA Jr. Hunter Under Saddle

19. AQHA Hunter Under Saddle Youth 13-under

20. AQHA Hunter Under Saddle Youth 14-18

21. Sr. Hunter Pleasure & AQHA Sr. Hunter Under Saddle

22. AQHA Hunter Under Saddle Amateur

23. Open Hunter Pleasure

** In this example, Jr. Hunter Pleasure and Sr. Hunter Pleasure are NOT AQHA-approved classes. Registered American Quarter Horses and current AQHA members may indicate to compete in these classes and be evaluated against the other horses in that class for a set of placings and additionally against other American Quarter Horses for a second set of placings and AQHA points. If there are 18 horses in this particular class and 9 are showing for AQHA placings, AQHA points will only be awarded as if 9 horses were competing.*
